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Elections

City mayoral and council elections are held in November of even numbered years. The East Bethel City Council is composed of a Mayor and four City Council members who are elected at large. The Mayor's term is two years and each Council Member's term is four years. At the November 2, 2010 General Election, there will be two at large council member seats (four year terms) and the mayor's seat (two year term) on the ballot. Candidates filing for these elected positions begins at 8:00 AM on August 3, 2010 and closes on August 17, 2010 at 5:00 PM. Any qualified voter may be a candidate for public office in the City of East Bethel by filing an Affidavit of Candidacy with the City Clerk and paying a \$5 filing fee. To be eligible to file for candidacy, you have to be eligible to vote in Minnesota, have not filed for the same or any other office in the upcoming primary or general election, are or will be on assuming office, 21 years of age or more, have maintained residence in the City for at least 30 days before the general election and meet any other qualifications for the office as prescribed by law.

The City of East Bethel currently has three precincts. The polling place for each precinct is:

Precinct #1 - East Bethel Community/Senior Center, 2241 221st Avenue NE

Precinct #2 - Our Saviour's Lutheran Church, 19001 Jackson Street NE

Precinct #3 - East Bethel Fire Station, 2751 Viking Blvd. NE

If you are unsure which precinct you are in, call City Hall (763-367-7853) or you can look up your polling place location

on the Secretary of State's Web site at <http://pollfinder.sos.state.mn.us>.

Before you can vote, you must register. In Minnesota, you may register 20 days before Election Day for your name to appear on the polling place roster, or, on Election Day at your polling place.

Your registration remains current until you move, change your name, or do not vote for four consecutive years. You may update your registration information by completing another Voter Registration Application.

Am I eligible to vote?

You may register and vote in Minnesota on the next Election Day if you:

- * will be at least 18 years old on or before Election Day
- * are a citizen of the United States
- * will have resided in Minnesota for 20 days immediately preceding Election Day
- * have any felony conviction record discharged, expired, or completed
- * are not under court-ordered guardianship where a court has revoked your voting rights
- * have not been ruled legally incompetent by a court of law

Registering before Election Day

You may register to vote by completing a Voter Registration Application and submitting it by mail or in-person to your local election official.

For your name to appear on the polling place roster, register at least 20 days before Election Day. For the 2010 State Primary register by July 20th, and for the 2010 State General Election register by October 12th. You may pick up a voter registration application at City

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2011 Budget Preparations

Planning for the 2011 budget began by city staff in April. Each department head has made projections that include information as to maintenance and operation of their department.

A proposed budget will be submitted to the City Council by July 1, 2010.

The City Council's review of the proposed 2011



budget will take place during July and continue into August. Residents are welcome to attend the meetings and offer comment.

Prior to September 15, 2010 the City Council will adopt a preliminary tax levy and budget for 2011 at a regularly scheduled City Council meeting.

After November 10th and on or before November 24th, property owners will receive, from

Anoka County, a notice of proposed property taxes payable in 2011. This notice will also list the December 2010 City Council meeting as the date when the City Council will discuss and determine the final tax levy and the budget for 2011.

Registering on Election Day

If you are not registered to vote or need to update your registration information, you may do so at local polling location on Election Day. However, you are required to provide proof of residence when registering on Election Day.

To register at your polling place on Election Day, you must have **one** of the following with your current name and address in the precinct to verify your residence:

- * A valid Minnesota driver's license, learner's permit, Minnesota ID card, or receipt for any of these
- * A valid student ID card including your phone, if your college has provided a student housing list to election officials
- * A Tribal ID card that contains your picture and signature
- * A valid registration in the same precinct under a different name or address
- * A notice of late registration sent to you by your county auditor or city clerk
- * A voter registered in the same precinct as you who can confirm your address with a signed oath
- * An employee of the residential facility where you live who can confirm your address with a signed oath

Alternatively, you may provide both 1) a photo ID from the list below, and 2) a current bill with your current name and address in the precinct.

Photo IDs (may be expired)

- * Minnesota Drivers License
- * Minnesota ID Card
- * United States Passport
- * Tribal ID Card
- * Minnesota University, College, or Technical College ID Card

Bills (delivered electronically or by mail)

- * Utility bill due within 30 days of election day
 - Telephone (landline, cell, VOIP, etc)
 - TV (cable, satellite, etc)
 - Electric
 - Gas
 - Solid Waste
 - Sewer Services
 - Water
- * Rent Statement dated within 30 dates of election that itemizes utilities

Registering When Civil Rights are Restored

In Minnesota, you cannot vote while serving a sentence as a result of a felony conviction. However, once the full sentence is completed – including parole and probation – commonly called “off paper”; the right to vote is automatically restored. What's Happening at Public Works? By Jack Davis, Public Works Manager June 2010

The Park and Ride lot at the East Bethel Ice Arena is open. This lot is located adjacent to and south of the main Arena parking lot. This lot is served by the new service road to the Ice Arena that was substantially completed in November 2008. Access to the new service road can be reached from 209th Avenue or Davenport Street. This road provides a much improved and safer entrance to this facility.

The Wild Rice Drive Reconstruction Project will be completed on or before July 15, 2010. The major improvements to this street include a realigned intersection with Viking Boulevard, elevated curves, drainage improvements and paved widened shoulders on both sides of the street. Bids for the overlay of 200th Lane and 5th Street will be advertised by the end of this month and both projects are anticipated starting at the end of July 2010.

Resurfacing and regrading of 2 miles of unpaved streets with Class V material and lime rock is scheduled for Zumbrota Street, Allen Street and Skylark Drive.

This project will begin in August 2010. Seal-coating of approximately 7 miles of street was completed on June 25, 2010. Bataan Street is scheduled to be seal-coated in August of 2010. This project will be done in conjunction with the Phase I Booster East/Cedar Creek Trail Project.

A new skate park has been installed at Maynard Peterson Park and the pavilion has been completed at the Fish Lake Nature Trail entrance at the Cedar Creek Ecosystem and Scientific Reserve. Both of these facilities are open for public use.

Proposed 2010 park improvement projects include irrigation projects at Hidden Haven and Whispering Oaks Parks and play ground equipment replacement at John Anderson and Hidden Haven Parks. These projects are scheduled to be completed by the end of June 2010. The Coon Lake Beach Park is being renovated and will be finished by the end of July. Other Park improvement projects scheduled for 2010 include the expansion of the parking lot at Booster West Park and fencing at

Eveleth Park.

The route for Phase I of the trail from Booster Park to the Cedar Creek Ecosystem and Science Reserve (CCESR) is in the final phase of design and easement acquisition. This phase, from Booster East Park to 224th Avenue, Xylite Street and 222nd Lane to Bataan Street, will be part of a long term project to connect these facilities and serve as a neighborhood trail connector to the Booster Parks. This project will be completed over a two year period with the section on Bataan and 224th Avenue and Xylite Street scheduled for completion by September 2010 and the section on 222nd Lane scheduled for completion in June of 2011.

Is This A Temporary Structure?

In the January 2010 city newsletter we discussed detached accessory structures. As staff conducts inspections we continue to see more of what residents refer to as temporary structures being erected through out the city. City Code, Appendix A, Zoning, Section 1.9, Definitions provides the following guidance/definitions:

1. **ACCESSORY STRUCTURE OR FACILITY:** Any building or improvement clearly subordinate to a principle use such as garages, sheds or storage buildings located on the same parcel as the principle structure.
2. **STRUCTURE:** Anything constructed or erected, the use which requires location on the ground or

attachment to something having location on the ground.

3. **STRUCTURE, TEMPORARY:** Structures that are of a mobile nature and located on a property for no more than six months in a 12 month period, such as ice fishing shanties, camping tents, enclosed trailers and other similar facilities.

Section 14 of the City Zoning Code, DETACHED ACCESSORY STRUCTURES, specifies general

regulations and architectural design requirements. The typical temporary detached structures that are encountered have a metal or plastic tubing as the structure and metal

sheathing or a vinyl/canvas material as the exterior covering. Most of these structures either do not comply with the intent of the zoning ordinance and/or do not meet minimum building code requirements.

Staff has provided compliance notices to property owners asking that they remove these types of structures. Although you are not required to obtain a building permit for a structure that does not exceed 120 square feet you are required to comply with zoning regulations which requires that architectural design and setback requirements for your zoning district are complied with.

Staff recommends that you contact City Hall prior to erecting your accessory structure. We are here to assist you with all your improvement projects.

their efforts to be vigilant of each other and their property, it will likely result in the reduction of criminal incidents.

Fireworks Safety

Americans love fireworks! They are dazzling and exciting, but they can also be dangerous if used improperly. Fireworks need to be handled with care!

If you plan to purchase fireworks, carefully inspect the packages to be sure you only purchase legal fireworks designed for consumer use. Learn to differentiate between legal consumer fireworks and dangerous explosive devices. The State of Minnesota requires that legal fireworks show the name of the item, the name of the manufacturer or distributor and easy-to-read cautionary labeling, and instructions for proper use.

In Minnesota, examples of fireworks that are permitted include sparklers, cones and tubes that emit sparks, novelty items like snakes, and party poppers.

Explosive and aerial fireworks are prohibited for public sale, posses-

sion and use in the State of Minnesota. Prohibited fireworks include firecrackers, bottle rockets, missiles, roman candles, mortars and shells.

Remember; if it flies, goes boom or explodes, the firework is probably illegal! Don't use it.

Keep these tips in mind:

- * Never allow children to play with or ignite fireworks
- * Read and follow all warnings and instructions
- * Be sure other people are out of range before lighting fireworks.
- * Only light fireworks on a smooth, flat surface away from the house, dry leaves and flammables materials.
- * Never try to relight fireworks that have not fully functioned.
- * Keep a bucket of water in case of a malfunction or fire.
- * Read, understand and follow the instructions on each device prior to using.

- * Use fireworks with close adult supervision.
- * Choose a safe place to use fireworks that is far from anything that could be damaged from the normal or abnormal operation of any device.
- * Fireworks should only be ignited outdoors and away from animals, buildings, storage tanks, brush or combustible materials.
- * Anyone acting in an irresponsible manner or who appears to be under the influence of alcohol or other drugs should not handle or discharge fireworks.
- * Keep fireworks away from small children and store them in a cool dry location away from sources of ignition (heat and flames).
- * Fireworks should not be allowed to become wet and should not be used when dried after becoming wet.
- * Do not carry fireworks in your pocket or on your person.
- * Lit cigarettes, cigars, pipes or open flames should be kept away from fireworks that are for sale or when stored.

Upper Rum River Watershed Management Organization

Lakes, streams, and the Rum River are the focus of the Upper Rum River Watershed Management Organization (URRWMO). This special purpose unit of government is formed jointly by the cities of Bethel, East Bethel, Ham Lake, Nowthen, Oak Grove, and St. Francis. The URRWMO area has several high quality waterbodies, including East Twin Lake, Lake George, and the Rum River. But there are concerns too, including water quality in Crooked Brook and Rogers Lake. The URRWMO works to protect high water quality and improve it where necessary. They especially concentrate on water-related issues that cross municipal boundaries, requiring multi-city coordination.

Rum River Erosion and Water Quality

The Rum River is arguably our most notable waterbody. Locally, the Rum River is designated as a state Scenic and Recreational Waterway, is a great fishery, and is thought to have good water quality. To assess the river's current condition, the URRWMO has begun systematic monitoring of the river's water quality. Additionally, in 2010 the river was surveyed to identify erosion and other issues which affect water quality.

Water quality monitoring of the river is occurring at both the north and south ends of the URRWMO area. This allows detection of any changes that may occur along this stretch of the river. To date, they've

observed little change in water quality from St. Francis to the northern boarder of Ramsey. However, there is a low-level increase in chlorides from upstream to downstream, which is likely due to road deicing salts. The chloride increase exists throughout the year, because these salts have infiltrated into the shallow groundwater that feeds the river during dry conditions. During summer storms the chlorides are diluted, further evidence that groundwater is an important source. The highest salt concentrations would likely occur during spring melt, but this has not yet been monitored. Road salts are a widespread water quality concern, especially downstream where road densities are higher due to urbanization.

This spring the URRWMO mapped erosion and other possible impacts to the river, such as violations of State scenic river rules. Riverbank erosion can threaten water quality, fish habitat, and properties through decreased shoreline stability. Overall, this stretch of the river is beautiful, but some problem areas were identified. The URRWMO will be contacting property owners and offering assistance to those interested in improving their property.

Grants

How we manage our own properties can have significant impacts on lakes and rivers, both positive and negative. Understanding the public benefits of high water quality, the URRWMO offers grants to encourage water quality improvement projects on private property. Cost-share grants are available to landowners for projects such as erosion

control, stormwater runoff treatment, and/or native vegetation restoration adjacent to lakes and streams. Applications are accepted at any time on a first-come, first-serve basis. The grants are competitive, and the highest ranking projects will be those that will most directly benefit a public waterbody.

Grants typically cover 50-70% of project materials. Remaining costs and labor are the landowner's responsibility. The Anoka Conservation District (ACD) offers free on-site consultations and can assist with project design.
